

Bristol Borough resident Patrick W. Mulhern has been chosen for this year's *"Person of the Year"* Award. Patrick is a remarkable person who has distinguished himself through service in various fields that involved empowerment and motivation for those whose lives he touches.

Growing up on Radcliffe Street just across from the banks of the Delaware River, the young Patrick showed a streak of the daredevil in him by swimming across from Bristol to Burlington Island. Looking back, those adventures set the stage for just one of the many careers that he would embrace.



Patrick studied Business Administration at Bucks County Community College while working for the United States Postal Service, where he served as an Advocate for Letter Carriers. He was a Legislative Ambassador for the AFL-CIO and later worked as a United Way Counselor for 17 years.

While studying at McGonigle's Mixed Martial Arts with his family, Patrick ca me to admire the steady transformation of fellow students toward better health, confidence, and discipline. This eventually led to an unexpected career change.

Even as he began his practice as a Clinical Exercise Specialist, his thenteen-age daughter Caitlin's diabetes diagnosis opened another door of service for Patrick. He was appointed to the board of the American Diabetes Association of the Philadelphia region and

helped develop programs and lectures stressing the importance of exercise as part of treatment protocols for diabetes and other diseases. Patrick received several recognitions from leading medical facilities including the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

Patrick continues to give his time and talents to various local, civic organizations. Most recently he has devoted himself to a special project that is close to his heart—protecting and preserving Bristol Borough's biggest natural assets, the Delaware River and Burlington Island. The 300-plus acre natural site, known as Burlington Island, sits between Bristol Borough, PA and the City of Burlington, NJ.

As president of the Friends of Burlington Island (FOBI), Patrick can often be



seen boating or kayaking across the water to oversee the creation of walking trails, educational programs for youth groups and adults alike, and a twice-a-year cleanup he and FOBI conduct. Patrick's focus is one of the reasons why the river and the island's appeal increases annually, having a

direct impact on Bristol Borough's Day wharf and commercial corridor along Mill and Market Streets.

Patrick is co-owner of Driftwood Water Adventures (DWA) with Bristol

Borough Middle School teacher, Robert Moyer. Established in 2012, DWA offers kayak, paddleboard, and canoe rentals, lessons, and sales at two locations—Falls Township Community

Park and Tyler State Park. In addition, Patrick provides personal **DRIFTWOOD** training services to a select group of private clients.

Patrick is married to fellow Bristolian, Dawn Rumovitz, a registered nurse, and is the father of three children, Patrick Sean, Caitlin, and Shannon. Patrick still lives on Radcliffe Street, next door to his boyhood home, where his 92-year old mother still lives.


Ron McGinn Bristol High School

Jacob also participated in Reading Olympics, Chem Club, Service Learning Club, Garden Club, and Writer's Voice. Jacob was a three-time State qualifier and Senior Caption for the Varsity Cross Country Team and twotime District and one-time State qualifier for the Track Team. Jacob was also on the Varsity Basketball Team and worked parttime at Rite Aid during his senior year. Although history is his favorite subject, Jacob's major is yet undecided as he currently attends Kutztown University.

In response to Bristol Borough's aging firefighting volunteer force, the AOC is working with several partners to find options to encourage local firefighting volunteerism. Part of this exploration includes piloting a fire science program at Bristol High School to introduce, educate, and encourage young people to consider volunteering at 1 of 4 firehouses across town.



The decline of volunteer firefighters is not unique to Bristol Borough. Since the 1970s, the ranks of volunteer firefighters in Pennsylvania have dropped from 360,000 to fewer than 37,000. The impact of this phenomenon is clear. Local firefighter volunteerism needs to increase, or this public service could become a full-time force paid for by taxpayers.

The AOC was awarded an \$8,000 grant from Dow Corporation in September 2023. This grant is dedicated to school staff receiving Out-of-School Time (OST)-focused STEM professional development and providing student field trips to The Franklin Institute for Bristol Borough School District students. Professional development training is happening this month. The student field trips to The Franklin Institute will happen during the second half of the academic school year in 2024.

and of Union Theological Seminary in New York. She was a founding member and officer of the Greater Hartford Interfaith Coalition for Equity & Justice and was active in Congregations United for Racial Equality & Justice, a collaboration between Bethel A.M.E. Church and several Unitarian Universalist congregations in Connecticut. She is an active member of the Concerned Pastors of Bristol and Vicinity, a gathering of Black clergy with a heart for social justice. Rev. Brooks has a deep commitment to the development of ministry to children within the church and beyond the walls. She holds a weekly chapel service for Children of God Educational, LLC in Bristol.

Rev. Brooks is the proud mama of five and grandmama of nine more, two of whom she adopted after the loss of their mother. Emanuel, age ten, and Malia, age six, are the joy of her life at home while Jesus Christ remains the center of her joy in the Lord!

BETHEL A.M.E. CHURCH HISTORY

The African Methodist Episcopal Church was born in 1787 in Philadelphia in protest against social injustice in the house of God. Incorporated in 1816 as a denomination where persons of African descent could worship "under their own vine and fig tree," the African Methodist Episcopal Church has a proud and illustrious history that spans the globe and impacts the lives of millions in the struggle for freedom and justice for all of God's children. Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Bristol, Pennsylvania, was founded in 1843 and has faithfully served the community of Bristol and surrounding towns for almost two hundred years. Twenty-five pastors have served the congregation during its history.

JOHN MUNDY & THE MILL STREET RUN

JOHN V. MUNDY is a legendary track and field coach whose passion for running began in his youth. Taking shape at Holy Ghost Prep, Mundy initiated the school's first competitive track & field team as a student. Following college, he shifted gears to coaching and established a pedigree for consistently producing some of the area's top track & field champions. His contribution to the sport of track & field is forever celebrated by the dedication of the John Mundy Track at Holy Ghost Prep.

Mundy solidified his role in the sport of track and field by establishing the **MILL STREET RUN**, which will celebrate its 57th anniversary on Saturday, September 7, 2024. The Mill Street run is recognized as one of the top competitive high-school track & field events on both sides of the Delaware River attracting most of the areas' top high-school track and field competitors.

Mundy has recently become a key volunteer in Bristol Borough's summer camp program, offering a track & field clinic to interested Bristol Borough youth. His delivery of personalized coaching and invaluable experience is inspiring a new generation of runners. Students attending this mini-clinic are able to participate in the youth category of the annual Mill Street Run, called the Open Race, for free.

Mundy is recognized for his unique talent to build dynamic team atmospheres with winning results. He innately understands the capabilities of each athlete and believes in them. Because he clearly loves what he is doing and is excited about getting to know his athletes, he inspires them to get the most out of their abilities. Now, that's a WINNER!

The AOC, Bristol Riverside Theatre, and Snyder-Girotti Elementary School partnered to provide ArtRageous, a unique performing arts program, for all students in grades 1 through 3, during the 2021 - 2022 and 2022 - 2023 school years. ArtRageous' focus is on hip-hop dance introducing students to a range of street dance styles primarily performed to hip-hop music central to hip-hop culture. Hip-hop dance was determined to be the right antidote to the pandemic's impact on students' well-being and an undeniable tool for healing and wellness.

AOC HIGHLIGHTS: 2020 TO 2023 YEARS IN REVIEW

Covid-19's Impact on Education and Learning in Bristol Borough 2020-2021

It has been three years since the last Bristol Fall Classic because of Covid-19. The AOC's work and activities supporting Bristol Borough's public and parochial schools came to a screeching halt when the country was forced to stay home because of the pandemic.

Within weeks of the pandemic's arrival and at the direction of Dr. Rose Minniti, former Bristol Borough School District Superintendent, the AOC arranged and paid for wireless access points providing students and faculty connectivity to maintain learning. As the pandemic evolved, being wirelessly connected to the school's network allowed students to learn synchronously and asynchronously accommodating the shifts in education and enabling new learning environments.

The indirect effects of the pandemic, such as the degradation of socialization and behavior, were equally noticeable and disruptive. In response, the AOC initiated virtual workshops for parents on a variety of topics including practical steps to support children at home and how to help students learn to develop healthy friendships.

The AOC also knows with certainty that student test scores were negatively impacted, sliding further away from minimum test standards published by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Education. Knowing the lingering effects of disrupted learning, this circumstance further exacerbates opportunities for our students to embrace the fundamentals of life-long learning and to position them for success across all sectors of life, now and in the future.

The devastating impact on education and learning across the globe triggered by the pandemic still lingers. Bristol Borough schools have not been exempt from this phenomenon. In fact, we may have experienced an unequal impact on how the pandemic affected learning given the region's socio and economic realities. Moreover, the AOC has also become aware of higher stress levels and larger class sizes that have become a new norm since Covid-19.

For all these reasons and more, THANK YOU for your continued support. Without your commitment to local public and parochial education, the AOC would not have been able to pivot when Covid-19 arrived and adjust to new and unfamiliar circumstances.

The Bristol Fall Classic is an annual fundraiser hosted by the AOC (Academic Oversight Committee) with proceeds benefitting after-school and summer programs for Bristol Borough youth. This event is part of the effort to remain compliant with the guidelines of the 21st Century Community Learning Center grants awarded to Bristol Borough School District by the PA Department of Education.

2023 Special Project PILOTING FIREFIGHTING FUNDAMENTALS AT BRISTOL HIGH SCHOOL

In pilot mode now at Bristol High School is a Firefighting Fundamentals course. This program will orient students about firefighting science and what it takes to become a volunteer firefighting for their community.

Since the 1970s, the ranks of volunteer firefighters in Pennsylvania have dropped from 360,000 to fewer than 37,000. The AOC is working with the Bristol Borough School District and School Board, Bristol High School administrators, Bristol Borough Fire Department, and Bucks County Community College on this pilot aided by Tom Shaffer, a former Bristol Borough School District Superintendent and multi-decade Pottsville, PA volunteer firefighter with relationships at the state's Office of the State Fire Commissioner.

There is a critical need for volunteer firefighters in Bristol Borough as many of our volunteers are aging out.



The AOC has supported the Writers' Voice program, part of BHS' interdisciplinary program, to spur creative thinking, presentation and performance skills, and the full spectrum of publishing.

Established in 1997 by Mike Girard and Deb Fine, students experience in-class instruction, a guest lecturer from the University of Pennsylvania, and a retreat at Silver Bay YMCA – Conference and Family Retreat Center. Other mandatory requirements include a public parent presentation of students' poetry and writing at the Margaret R. Grundy Memorial Library.

The value and benefits students derive from this program are many such as enriched written and verbal communication skills, enhanced confidence, and self-image, boosted critical thinking, problem-solving capabilities, and motivational techniques, and increased leadership skills all essential abilities necessary to succeed in today's complex environments encountered after graduation.

Joseph A. Saxton Community Service Endowment Fund

The AOC established the Joseph A. Saxton Community Service Endowment Fund (the "Fund") in 2022 to honor its former board member, to preserve his memory and impact of community service. The Fund seeks to leverage and reinforce community service, inhabited, and exhibited by Joseph A. Saxton during his lifetime lived entirely in Bristol Borough, PA.

The Joseph A. Saxton Community Service Endowment Fund will award grants, based on the discretion of the Fund's Trustees, to a non-profit organization presented on behalf of a current or former Bristolian, focused on the greater good of the community, that imbues, embodies, and exhibits the same kind of commitment to community service --- to make Bristol Borough a better place for all its citizens --- as "Joe" or "Sax" or "the Mayor" did every day throughout his 72 years.



Purpose, Goal, and Objective:

• Identify an organization that promotes and elevates volunteerism and community service across Bristol Borough's diverse population and neighborhoods in the manner and spirit displayed by Joseph A. Saxton.

Eligibility & Award:

To be eligible for a Joseph A. Saxton Community Service Endowment Fund grant award these minimum standards are applicable:

- Organizations must be a registered and certified 501 c-3 non-profit, doing good works in Bristol Borough, Pennsylvania, and recognized in good standing by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of State, Bureau of Corporations and Charitable Organizations, Charities Section.
- Grant awards are non-restrictive meaning there are no restrictions or limitations on how the grant award is to be invested or to be used.
- Awarding a grant on an annual basis is desirable, but not required.

Trustees:

- Five Bristolians are to be appointed as Trustees of the Fund, serving concurrent two and three-year terms.
- The Board of Trustees shall invest and manage the Fund, with and in coordination with Penn Community Bank, as a prudent investor would, by considering the purpose, terms, distribution requirements, and other circumstances of the Fund.
- The Board of Trustees shall select an individual associated with an organization (NPO) that mirrors Joseph A. Saxton's commitment to community service by awarding a non-restrictive \$1,000 grant.
